As part of CPS Global commitment to the environment we:

- Implement and maintain an Environmental Management System to adhere to current Environmental Protection Legislation (in each state)
- Continually improve our environmental management performance through reviews – Company Training Meetings where environmental issues are a feature agenda item
- Develop and set environmental benchmarks and KPI's on an annual basis and review performance against these
- Communicate CPS environmental policy to all employees, subcontractors, clients and the public – through inductions and training sessions and site meetings
- Implement our detailed management action plan in the event of an environmental accident (e.g. chemical spillage or EME leakage)
- Seek to develop energy and resource saving work methods – e.g. avoid leaving machinery running when not in use
- Seek to develop work methods that reduce the risk of environmental damage – e.g. carry only sufficient fittings or devices to complete jobs satisfactorily on a daily basis
- Maintain knowledge of and compliance with relevant eco-related legislation and regulations – refer to the company's Regulatory Monitoring Procedure and download the latest environmental rulings and requirements
- Adhere to Waste Minimisation and Management legislation (as amended) when transporting waste and dispose of correctly via licenced collection providers.
